

## CAMPGROUND RULES

**Thank you for camping with us at the Old Threshers Reunion. We are glad to have you as our guest. The following are some guidelines to help to make everyone's stay more enjoyable. Please treat it with respect.**

- First and foremost, relax and enjoy yourself. Treat your neighbors with respect and make new friends. Quiet hours in the campground are 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
- Your camping registration includes exclusive use of your assigned camp site (assigned amount of space) and 1 vehicle for all registered campers. Extra vehicles must be parked in our designated lot outside the campground gates.
- No one may reserve, hold, or rope off any campsite.
- Individuals reserving or purchasing a camp site in the Old Threshers campgrounds must be 21 years of age or older to reserve in their name. All campsites must be under the supervision of a parent, guardian, or chaperone who is 21 years of age or older.
- **PLEASE** drive slowly through the campground for everyone's safety! The posted speed limit is **10MPH**. Please be alert for the unexpected, and make sure to abide by all traffic signs.
- Please leave your campsite as clean as you found it. Place bagged garbage in one of the dumpsters located throughout the campground. Please break down cardboard boxes and other large items.
- Charcoal and gas grills are permitted. **No ground or wood fires of any kind.** Propane fire pits are permitted.
- If you smoke, please dispose of your cigarette and cigar butts properly. For the comfort of all guests, all buildings and the grandstand venue are smoke free at the Reunion.
- Pets should be on no longer than a 4' leash and escorted by their owner at all times. You are expected to pick up after your pet wherever you walk. Pets should never be left unattended, to run loose, or tied outside your camper without the owner present. Pets should have proof of rabies vaccination. Only ADA Animals allowed on Show Grounds. - The bathroom sinks are not to be used for washing dishes or clothing.
- No digging of ground at your campsite for any reason without prior permission. This includes for the purpose of leveling your camper.
- Generators can be used between 9:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. If your generator is too noisy and is disturbing to your neighbor, you will be asked to turn it off.
- There are two dump stations provided for your convenience. You can also stop at Campground Hospitality and purchase an onsite pump of your holding tank. Waste water and gray water must not be dumped on the ground.
- The nearest hospital is located about 2 miles from the campground at 407 South White Street. (319-385-3141) You are in Henry County, Iowa, Severe Weather Alerts can be heard on area TV or radio. Suggested radio station: KILJ FM 105.5. You may also sign up for TEXT alerts by picking up the text alert information sheet at the Camper Registration Building. Early warning sirens are located next to the Trolley Barn.
- No bicycles, golf carts, ATV's, horses, tractors or lawn tractors to be used as personal conveyance vehicles in the campgrounds. No hauling trailers allowed in campgrounds.

The site you occupy is to be used solely for temporary camping purposes and not as a permanent residence. Failure to comply with Midwest Old Threshers campground rules, policies, and local regulations, including but not limited to maintaining a clean campsite, observing quiet hours, and proper use of utilities. Failure to comply may result in termination of use of the campsite immediately.
